



Dear Parents/Carers,

I am excited to report that work has begun on our new library! At half-term the wall between the Pentagon Suite and the old Music Room was knocked down to create one large room, ready for the library shelving to be installed over the May half-term. The picture below will give you an idea of what the finished library will look like.



We are anticipating that it is going to take us a month to catalogue all the books on to the *Junior Librarian* computer system so that the children can scan their books in and out. We will also be installing *Accelerated Reader* which supports reading in KS2 (details of this will follow nearer the opening time) which will also require us to put stickers on books. If you could spare any free time, or know of anyone who could help, please let the office know.

We have been able to fund the building work and the library shelving, but we need to raise some more funds to purchase the tables, stools, TV screen (which is in the middle of the 'media wall') and to purchase more books to fill our library. 

Staff Car Park – Please can I ask Parents/Carers not to park vehicles in front of the staff car park gates, when either bringing a child to school because they are late or for dropping something off.
