

Daily google meets

During these times we are continually reflecting on our remote learning provision and the impact that it is having. The feedback that we have received regarding the class google meets from pupils and parents has been positive so far. We have also spoken to other schools that are having daily google meets sessions and they report that this daily opportunity for the children to touch base with their friends and teachers has been motivating and is having a positive impact on their mental well-being. Therefore from Monday 8th February all classes will be having a daily google meet. The timings for these will be:

- EYFS 9:00 am
- Y1 9:30 am
- Y2 -10:00 am
- Y3 11:00 am
- Y4 11:30 am
- Y5 1:30 pm
- Y6 2:00 pm

The length of the sessions will range from 20-30 minutes dependent on the age of the children. During the sessions the children will engage in a variety of activities like Maths and English games, show and tell, story times, etc.

As we hope to be seeing the children daily, teachers will only be calling families of the children that they haven't seen, or are not submitting work, or where parents/carer have requested a call. Miss Watkins and her SEND team will still continue to make their usual phone calls.

The Big Lockdown Learning Parent Survey

Our school has been selected to participate in a national survey about how children are learning at home and the impact lockdown-learning is having on family life.

The benefits to the school:
