Context

% of pupil premium children is below average 48 children pupil premium @ May 2016

2014-2015 Outcomes

Phonics Year 1- FSM group low (57% compared to 83% - Non FSM)

KS1-FSM: below in R,W and M compared to other pupils and NA

KS2 - Maths FSM 86%, non FSM 91%

Progress in Reading and Writing is better for FSM

To close the attainment gap between pupil premium children and non-pupil premium children

To accelerate progress for pupil premium children

To improve quality first teaching
