Did you know ... Starfish are echinoderms (spiny skinned sea urchins). Also known as Sea Stars, they cannot swim and do not use gills to breathe. All echinoderms have five-point radial symmetry which means their body plan has five sections around a central area. Amazingly Sea Stars can regenerate lost arms, which is useful when threatened by a predator as the Starfish drops an arm to move quicker. It can take a year to grow back. Starfish have tiny eyes at the end of each arm, enabling them to view movement and know the difference between light and dark, although not with much detail.
